**A**rtist Alfredo de Giorgio Crimi was born in San Fratello, Sicily, in the province of Messina. As a youth, he and his family relocated

to Little Italy in New York. He went on to study at the National Academy of Design, eventually returning to Rome—honing his craft, studying fresco painting with

Professor Venturini Paperi. He returned to New York a well-trained muralist. One of Alfredo de Giorgio Crimi's many prominent U.S. commissions includes
