RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 116-____ TEXT OF H.R. 8015, DELIVERING FOR AMERICA

ACT

[Showing the text of H.R. 8015, as introduced, with modifications.]

1	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
2	This Act may be cited as the "Delivering for America
3	Act".
4	SEC. 2. PROMPT AND RELIABLE POSTAL SERVICES DURING
5	COVID-19 PANDEMIC.
6	(a) In General.—During the period beginning on
7	the date of enactment of this Act and ending on the last
8	day of the COVID-19 public health emergency or January
9	1, 2021, whichever is later, the United States Postal Serv-
10	ice may not implement or approve any change to the oper-
11	ations or the level of service provided by the Postal Service
12	from those in effect on January 31, 2020, that would re-
13	duce service performance or impede prompt, reliable, and
14	efficient services, including any of the following actions:
15	(1) Any change in the nature of postal services
16	which will generally affect service on a nationwide or
17	substantially nationwide basis.
18	(2) Any revision of service standards

1	(3) Any closure or consolidation of any post of-
2	fice or postal facility, or any reduction of such office
3	or facility hours.
4	(4) Any prohibition or restriction on use of pay-
5	ment of overtime pay to Postal Service officers or
6	employees.
7	(5) Any change that would prevent the Postal
8	Service from meeting its service standards or cause
9	a decline in measurements of performance relative to
10	those service standards.
11	(6) Any change that would have the effect of
12	delaying deferring, or curtailing mail, allowing for
13	the non-delivery of mail to a delivery route, or in-
14	creasing the volume of undelivered mail.
15	(7) Treating election mail as any class of mail
16	other than first-class mail, regardless of whether
17	such treatment requires payment of overtime pay to
18	officers or employees of the Postal Service.
19	(8) Removing, decommissioning, or any other
20	stoppage of mail sorting machines, other than for
21	routine maintenance.
22	(9) Removing or eliminating any mail collection
23	box that is available to the public.

1	(10) Enacting any rule, policy, or standard the
2	purpose or effect of which would delay the delivery
3	of mail to or from a government entity.
4	(11) Instituting any hiring freeze.
5	(b) REVERSAL OF POLICIES HINDERING DELIVERY
6	OF MAIL.—The United States Postal Service shall reverse
7	any initiative or action that is causing delay in processing
8	or delivery or non-delivery of the mail.
9	(c) Election Mail.—
10	(1) POLICY ON POSTMARKS.—It shall be the
11	policy of the United States Postal Service to post-
12	mark, which shall include any imprinted indicia from
13	the Postal Service that indicates the date of receipt,
14	all election mail processed by the Postal Service.
15	(2) SAME-DAY PROCESSING.—The United
16	States Postal Service shall ensure, to the maximum
17	extent practical, that election mail is processed and
18	cleared from any postal facility or post office on the
19	same day it is received at such a facility or post of-
20	fice.
21	(d) Definitions.—In this section—
22	(1) the term "COVID-19 public health emer-
23	gency" means the public health emergency declared
24	by the Secretary of Health and Human Services on

1	January 27, 2020, with respect to the 2019 Novel
2	Coronavirus;
3	(2) the term "election mail" means mail con-
4	sisting of—
5	(A) voter registration application forms,
6	completed voter registration application forms,
7	and voter registration cards or similar mate-
8	rials;
9	(B) absentee and other mail-in ballot appli-
10	cation forms, blank absentee and other mail-in
11	ballots, and completed absentee and other mail-
12	in ballots; and
13	(C) other materials relating to an election
14	which are mailed by a State or local election of-
15	ficial to individuals who are registered to vote
16	in the election; and
17	(3) the term "government entity" means the
18	Federal Government or any State (as that term is
19	defined in section 311 of title 5, United States
20	Code) or local government and any subdivision
21	thereof.
22	SEC. 3. ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION FOR THE POSTAL
23	SERVICE.
24	There is appropriated, out of any money in the Treas-
25	ury not otherwise appropriated, for the fiscal year ending

- 1 September 30, 2020, for an additional payment to the
- 2 Postal Service Fund (established under section 2003 of
- 3 title 39, United States Code), \$25,000,000,000, to remain
- 4 available until expended. Of the amount appropriated in
- 5 the previous sentence, \$15,000,000 shall be transferred to
- 6 "United States Postal Service—Office of Inspector Gen-
- 7 eral—Salaries and Expenses".

8 SEC. 4. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.

- 9 Nothing in this Act shall be construed to alter or oth-
- 10 erwise effect the terms and conditions of section 3406 of
- 11 title 39, United States Code (relating to balloting mate-
- 12 rials under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee
- 13 Voting Act).

14 SEC. 5. BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

- 15 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amounts provided by this Act
- 16 are designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to
- 17 section 4(g) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010
- 18 (2 U.S.C. 933(g)).
- 19 (b) Designation in the Senate.—In the Senate,
- 20 this Act is designated as an emergency requirement pursu-
- 21 ant to section 4112(a) of H. Con. Res. 71 (115th Con-
- 22 gress), the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal
- 23 year 2018.
