Re: Workers Memorial Day

Dear Sisters and Brothers:

Every year on April 28, the unions of the AFL-CIO come together to observe Workers Memorial Day and to remember those who have suffered and died on the job and to renew the fight for safe jobs. The theme of this year's Workers Memorial Day is "Working For Safe Jobs." It is our hope this year that we will come together to call for work in this country that is safe and healthy and pays fair wages. It is the goal of the AFL-CIO that we will celebrate the victories won by working people and commit to fighting until all workers have safe jobs and the freedom to form unions without the threat of retaliation.

Four decades ago, Congress passed the Occupational Safety and Health Act, promising every worker the right to a safe job. That Act was finally applied to the Postal Service in 1998. Unions and our allies have fought hard to make that promise a reality - winning protections that have made jobs safer, saved hundreds of thousands of lives, and prevented millions of workplace injuries and illnesses.

However our work is not done. Many job hazards are unregulated and uncontrolled. Some employers cut corners and violate the law, putting workers in serious danger and costing lives. Workers who report job hazards or job injuries are fired or disciplined. Employers contract out dangerous work to try to avoid responsibility. As a result, each year thousands of workers are killed and millions more injured or diseased because of their jobs.

On April 28, 2016, please remember those who have suffered and died on the job, and please renew the fight for safe workplaces. Speak out for safe jobs. Enclosed are materials with ideas and information to assist you.

### Dear Trade Unionist:

On April 28, 2016, the labor movement will once again observe Workers Memorial Day to remember workers who have been killed or injured on the job and to renew the fight for strong safety and health protections.

The Occupational Safety and Health Act and Mine Safety and Health Act promise workers the right to a safe job. Unions and our allies have fought hard to make that promise a reality - winning protections that have made jobs safer, saved hundreds of thousands of lives and prevented millions of workplace injuries and illnesses.

But our work is not done. Each year thousands of workers are killed and millions more injured or diseased because of their jobs. Many job hazards are unregulated and uncontrolled. Some employers cut corners and violate the law, putting workers in serious danger and costing lives. Workers who report job hazards or job injuries are fired or disciplined. At the same time, workers' wages are stagnant and inequality is growing.

Business groups have launched an all-out assault on working people, seeking to roll back existing protections and rights, and to block new safeguards. We have fought back, joining with worker centers, local activists and other partners to defend and advance these hard-won gains. We have worked to win a stronger coal dust standard for miners and a new rule to protect workers from deadly silica dust, which soon will be finalized, along with stronger anti-retaliation protections for workers who report job injuries.

The theme of this year's Workers Memorial Day is "Working. For Safe Jobs." We urge you to get involved and organize actions, activities, or observances in your workplaces and communities to highlight the toll of job injuries and deaths, and demand improvements in job safety protections. Make it clear that the labor movement is fighting for jobs that are safe and healthy and pay fair wages and guarantee the freedom of workers to form a union.
