The time to prepare for a hurricane is well in advance, before you hear the warnings from your local media. Be sure to inventory your emergency supply kit.

The Employee Assistance Program (EAP) -- a postal benefit provided through a contractual agreement with Magellan Health Services -- has an extensive hurricane preparedness checklist.

Keep items in an airtight bag and put your disaster supply kits into one or two easy-to-carry containers such as a plastic box with lid and handle, a duffel bag, or a backpack. Update your kit each year and rethink your needs at that time.
