NPMHU Request for Information on Function-1 Scheduler

As discussed during the last Semi-Annual Meeting of the Local Unions, the National CAD has been pressing the Postal Service for detailed information and worksheets relevant to the application of the Function-1 Scheduler in any and all mail processing facilities that may be affected by this management tool. Indeed, another meeting on this subject between NPMHU and management representatives is set for later this week.

In the meantime, and to protect against statutory deadlines, the National Office has filed an unfair labor practice charge with the National Labor Relations Board, alleging that the Postal Service has failed to bargain in good faith by providing all of the relevant information requested by the National Union. Attached to this memorandum, for your information, is a copy of that charge.

We will keep you apprised of developments as they occur.
